Message From The Director

I attended a "parent's night" meeting at a local school recently. The presentation highlighted a current mental health epidemic. The cause: social media!

The basic message was that we as parents are failing our children. We (as a society) are glued to our smart phones. We have to learn to put them down from time to time and focus on the things that are important in our lives, like our loved ones. What kind of example are we setting? Do your kids have to compete with your smartphone for your attention? Children are turning to social media for their source of love and connection, and it is a poor substitute for the love and connection needed from those who should care the most.

They also said giving a kid a smartphone without training and education is like handing them the keys to the car. We need to give guidelines and set clear expectations about phone usage. We need to help them understand the dangers that are prevalent out there. They need to know that it is never OK to send nudes, that they should not give out their address, and that there are dangerous people out there that will do them harm if given the chance.

Finally, when they do get a smart phone, parents should know what they are saying and seeing on social media. Befriend them, read their phones, and have oversight. It is not an invasion of privacy; it is being an aware parent and taking steps to keep them safe. It is a mental health epidemic because kids are committing suicide as a direct result. There are people actually encouraging your kids to commit suicide. And there are other issues tied to that "love and connection" to social media that when it is lost, they can't go on.



It takes a village! Be aware of your kids, your neighbor's kids, your kids friends, and all youth in general. If you or your kids are struggling, consider the library as a safe place. Come and be a part of our village.

Family History Month @ Your Library

Ralph Waldo Emerson said "Every book is a quotation; every house is a quotation out of all forests, and mines, and stone quarries; and every man is a quotation from all his ancestors."

October is designated in many countries as "Family History Month," and genealogists everywhere have adopted the month as their own. Whether you're new to genealogy, or have devoted a lifetime to it, celebrate Family History Month @ your library! Your reference librarians can direct you



to many historical documents located in our special collections, assist you in searching for records, and guide you to online resources.

Do you know that your library card is your passport to Heritage Quest® Online? HeritageQuest Online provides genealogical and historical sources for more than 60 countries, with coverage dating back as early as the 1700s. Heritage Quest is a collection of five core data sets: U.S. Federal Censuses, Genealogy and local history books, Periodical Source Index (PERSI), Revolutionary War records, and Freedman's Bank Records. Links to the U.S. Congressional Serial Set record are also available through the site.

Each of these data sets are rich in unique primary sources, local and family histories, and can be searched from your computer, tablet, or smartphone.

So find out where your heritage begins by using Heritage Quest Online. It delivers an essential collection of genealogical and historical sources— and with coverage dating back to the 1700s— it will help you find your ancestors and discover the roots of your family tree!


