Sometimes people are good at hiding their emotions, sometimes without context it might be difficult to know what emotion is being expressed (tears of joy, anger, sadness, etc.), and controlling emotions can be very difficult. When the adrenaline kicks in, it can be hard to think about anything, let alone control emotions in ourselves. At least that is the gist of what I have been studying.

So though you may be experiencing the emotions of joy, love, and happiness during this holiday season, please refrain from cartwheeling into the library. We are a great place to visit, which can elicit great joy, but we don't want to hurt anyone with our flying feet. If someone does something that makes you angry, think about it for a minute, think about different possible reasons why they did what they did, and choose not to be angry. It's your choice. And if you find yourself sad or lonely during the holidays, I'm sorry to hear, and I invite you to come hang


