


Message From The Director

I read recently about a man in northern Utah suspected of shooting at another car because of "road rage". Apparently, road rage is on the rise in Utah, and a guick google search shows several stories, including one where there was a baby in the back of the car. Now, everyone is talking about Chris Rock getting slapped, on stage, on camera, for the world to see. Seriously?

For our staff development day last year, we had Tracy Stock come and present on Emotional Intelligence, providing Platinum Service, and changing your mindset/behavior. Interestingly, the example she used to drive home her point was driving on the freeway. When someone cuts you off, and causes you to react, what is the story that you tell yourself. Many people jump to the anger (rage) side and focus on the disrespect of the other driver. And while in some cases, that may actually be the case, distracted driving with a cell phone, disregard for other drivers, etc., the truth is that we don't really know all the facts. We don't really know what that person is thinking, or going through. Tracy said, "How you interpret a situation-meaning the story you tell yourself about a certain set of facts-is what creates your emotions. No one can cause you to feel a certain way. Everyone totally owns their individual emotions.

If you want to change your outcomes or results, you must change the stories you tell yourself (the interpretations you make)" (https://takestockofyourlife.com/2021/06/). Consider alternatives. What if the other driver is dealing with a death in their family? What if the other driver is having a medical emergency? What if you were the one that messed up, would you want others to be patient with you? Alter the story, and control your emotions. Try to refrain from jumping up on stage and slapping people, or shooting at cars, or even just being angry.



We hope that our staff, patrons, visitors, community members, and everyone else can alter their story, control their emotions, and help make the library a safe place to be. We hope to see you soon.
