
In Journal of the Society for Information Display, February 2011 the predictions looked like this:

Within ten to 20 years:

- E-devices with magazine-quality color, viewable in bright sunlight but requiring low power. "Think of this as the green iPad or e-Reader, combining high function and high color with low power requirements." (University of Cincinnati's Jason Heikenfeld.)

- The e-Sheet, a virtually indestructible e-device that will be as thin and as rollable as a rubber place mat. It will be full color and interactive, while requiring low power to operate since it will charge via sunlight and ambient room light. However, it will be so "tough" and only use wireless connection ports, such that you can leave it out overnight in the rain. In fact, you'll be able to wash it or drop it without damaging the thin, highly flexible casing.
