

Library Program For The Blind and Disabled

The mission of the Washington County Library is to make readily available library materials that will meet the informational, educational, and recreational needs of all citizens of Washington County.

In an effort to manifest the goals of the mission statement, the Washington County Library System, in partnership with the Utah State Library, provides programs with materials in formats accessible to the blind, visually impaired, and disabled. Books and magazines are available in Braille, large print, and audio digital books. These services are provided free to eligible readers.

The USL provides digital players that are easier to use than traditional players. The players provide top grade sound quality in a light weight case that is design for ease of use to those with visual or physical impairments. Cartridges are loaded with either single titles, or multiple titles on "bookshelf" cartridges.

The Utah State Library has the largest collection of materials for the blind and visually impaired in the world, and has been a leader in innovative programs designed to assist the blind and disabled enjoy the gift of literature.
