# Fiction Book Review

"Mountains of Mourning" by Lois McMaster Bujold won the Hugo and the Nebula Awards for Best Novella in 1990. The book is one of the Vorkosigan Series, which centers around the life of Miles Vorkosigan, a physically-impaired interstellar spy and mercenary admiral from the planet Barrayar. The book is set approximately 1000 years in our future.

I highly recommend this book even though it is in a series because it can be read as a stand-alone novel. "Mountains of

Mourning" is a mixture of science fiction, mystery, and western genres. It starts out with a woman reporting the murder of her baby, because of a birth defect, in a small back country village in the Vorkosigan region. Miles Vorkosigan is sent to investigate, but because of his physical differences, has to get past the prejudices of the towns people before he can even begin to investigate the murder.



Lois McMaster Bujold does a great job getting her readers to relate to the characters and spinning a plot that will keep you involved and guessing. This book involves a lot of complex issues that will get you thinking as well. Loved it!
