# Message from the Director

Every year KUED holds a super reader party up in the Salt Lake City area. About November, students can sign up to participate in their reading program and read 20 minutes a day. All those who have read get to participate in their Super Reader Party. We found out that KUED offers a grant to outlying areas to do the same thing for those who can't make the trip to Salt Lake City. Washington County pooled its resources and received a grant to hold a KUED Super Reader party for Southwest Utah.

For the Southwest Utah Super Reader program, children from preschool to 5th grade are invited to participate. Most schools have children already reading 20 minutes a day. We are not requiring an extra 20 minutes, but we are allowing students to sign off on the super reader program when they do their normal reading. If you are just now hearing about this and your children have read 20 minutes a day in January, grab a reading chart and fill out the info and turn it in to your library branch by February 7th to receive a Super Reader ticket!

The Super Reader party will be open to all. We are having a Science with Seuss show and a Mime show. We will also have 3 bouncy castles available for the little ones. For those children who have read at least 600 minutes in January and turned in their log for a Super Reader ticket, they will get free pizza. If your child did not read, you are still welcome to come and enjoy the festivities, they just won't get free pizza.

Come one, come all, and enjoy the fun. We will be having the Super Reader Party on February 15, 2014, in the Town Square park from 10:00 – Noon. Its going to be a blast! Tell your friends and enjoy.

In conjunction with the Super Reader party, we will have a signing ceremony for the Declaration for the Right to Libraries. Community members can visibly declare their intent to have vibrant libraries in their community. The intent is to increase public and media awareness about the critical role of libraries in the community, inspire ongoing conversations about the role of the library, cultivate a network of allies and advocates, and position the library as a trusted convener to help in the response to community issues.



We will have the declaration available for signature from Feb. 15 – Feb. 28, but the Super Reader party will be the kick-off event.

Exciting times! Spread the word with your neighbors and friends, and we will see ya at the library!

# **Love Your Books!**

If you're like me, your parents and teachers instilled in you a reverence and respect for books at an early age. I remember the way I cared for the books I loved best as a child, but I also know that my most-loved books got the greatest wear and tear. I still have some old childhood story books that have a few crayon scribbles in them, and smears of various food substances and minor rips in pages. To me, those flaws are evidence of my childish love for the book.



Well, what we can do with books we own is quite different from what we can—or should—do with

books we borrow, books that are intended to be shared with our fellow readers in the community. The same is true for the electronic media we borrow.

The Washington County Library system staff members work hard to make books and other media available to everyone in good condition, and we understand that occasionally a heavily loved item is checked out so many times that it breaks while you are using it. You probably don't think you should be responsible for the replacement cost on an item that has sustained incremental damage over a period of time. The Library System recognizes normal wear and tear and replaces or discards the item without penalty to the patron.

On the other hand, the library system needs to enforce its lost and damaged policy in order to maintain an appropriate collection to serve all users across our big county. The fees that are in place are not only fair, but they are reasonable, given the continuously escalating costs of publications and electronic media. In fact, some lost or seriously damaged items simply are not available for replacement at any price the library can afford.

So this is a plea to you. Love your books, videos and audio discs. Enjoy them with your family and friends. But please remember that another user is waiting to have the same experience you have had, and future users are entitled to the same access to materials that you are enjoying.

But if you prepare to check out a book or disc, and it doesn't appear to be in good shape, you should call attention to your librarian about the problem. Make sure any significant damage is documented prior to checkout, or ask the librarian for a different copy, if available.

For your information, the following fines are enforced by the Washington County Library System:

Lost items: List price (or adjusted price), plus \$5.00

processing fee

Damaged items: Up to full cost, depending on damage and

number of checkouts

Audio disc replacement: \$10.00, or if not available, full purchase price.

The library and its content belong to you, but with that ownership comes a big responsibility to use its resources with love and respect—and to teach your children the same ethic.
