
# Message from the Director

I often walk past the "The Sandman" statue at the park in the St. George town center. It is dedicated as a reminder of the work that volunteers did in response to the flood in 2005. To me it is a reminder that in our beautiful Southern Utah area, there is the potential for devastation.

Though not on the same scale as in 2005, we have recently been hit with several strong rainstorms. The resulting flood waters have left our streets with the red dirt of our beautiful region. At the end of August, a large amount of that flood water filled the basement of the St. George library. I must say, that red dirt is not so pretty when it is caked on the floors and walls of the library. The flood waters filled the tech services area of the basement with about 3 feet of water and debris, and filled the rest of the basement with about 5 inches of water. Luckily no one was in the path of the water as it was strong enough to rip metal shelves off the wall and demolish a desk near the entry point.

The recovery effort is moving along strong. We were able to start sorting the salvageable items from the ruined items within the first day. Our tech services staff were quick to aid in the recovery process, and we had assistance from purgatory inmates in lifting and removing a lot of the heavy, wet, ruined items from the basement.

The walls are dried out, repaired, and repainted. The carpet is on order and should be installed within the first week or two of October. The baseboards and cabinets are being reinstalled. The elevator is being repaired. And we are working to reorder the lost materials, supplies, and books that were destroyed by the flood. A couple of walls have been built up to prevent future flooding, and we have fared well despite the heavy rains we have received since.



We thank you for your patience as we have recovered from this disaster, and look forward to providing quality library services to all of Washington County.

Each of these data sets are rich in unique primary sources, local and family histories, and can be searched from your computer, tablet, or smartphone.

So find out where your heritage begins by using Heritage Quest Online. It delivers an essential collection of genealogical and historical sources—with coverage dating back to the 1700s—that can help you find your ancestors and discover the roots of your family tree!






October is a great month to promote language and communication skills for your little readers. The colors and textures that abound in fall create opportunities to introduce new words to your child.
