## Message from the Director

The Utah Library Association (ULA) just held their annual conference at our very own Dixie Center here in St George. I encouraged the participation of many of our library employees in order to cultivate our capabilities as community servants. We hope you see the impact of this training in our programs and daily interaction.

One of the main focuses of the ULA conference this year was creativity and innovation. I'm excited to share with you one of the steps that we have taken to be more innovative and customer service oriented. We are moving forward with the purchase of RFID and self-checkout. We applied through the Institute of Museum and Library Services for the Library Services and Technology Act grant, a federal grant administered by the Utah State Library. We are excited to share that we were awarded \$52,690 for the implementation of RFID and self-checkout.

Sometime in late June or in early July, we will be installing several self-checkout machines throughout the system. Based on traffic, St George will receive two stations, and Washington, Hurricane, and Santa Clara will receive one station each.

The goal is to provide more options for checking out materials. As part of these installations, the Community Library Enhancement Fund, another grant provided by the Utah State library totaling \$27,258 will be used to install RFID enabled book drops. The new book drops will automatically check in the materials that are inserted into them. We will still maintain staff at the circulation desk to aid in checking out materials, but these new automated systems will provide another option for those who want to use them.

RFID will make it so that items can be checked out in bulk (up to a certain height) instead of just one item at a time. So even

those who do not want to use, or do not have access to self-checkout, should see a faster checkout process at the circulation desk.

We hope that you are pleased by the faster checkout times, smaller lines, and different options for checkout.
