## *Message from the Director*

Each New Year brings new opportunities and new beginnings. We expect 2016 will bring in great opportunities for the library. Our two main projects that we are working to finalize as we start the New Year are self-checkout and the new Hildale library.

The self-checkout project is very near completion. We met with a few delays, but are moving forward to be up and running by mid-January. The first delay was with the tagging process. It took us guite a bit longer to tag over 400,000 items with the new tags. However, we are completely tagged in St George (the largest branch) and about 90% tagged everywhere else in the system. The other delay was in the acquisition of a new book drop for St George. MK Solutions, the vendor for the self-checkout product, upgraded our book drop in St George at no cost, but that meant that there would be a delay in getting the new product. They should be here mid-January to install the new book drop and the actual self-checkout machines.

The other project we are working on is the new Hildale library. We are finalizing plans to acquire the Steed Sunday School building. Once acquired, we should be able to renovate and install many of the library supplies that we have already acquired. We were originally going to build a new library in Hildale, but we believe that the current building has the space needed to be a great library. That means that we can start up a great library at a substantially low cost to the taxpayer. We would not need a new bond to build a new library, but can create a great library facility mostly from our current budget.

The library will continue to strive to innovate as we move into the future. We will work to provide quality library
