Message From The Director

People with "Sense"

In last month's article in this space I quoted from Dr. Benjamin Franklin. When asked to donate a bell, Franklin responded with an offer of books for the town's residents, acknowledging that "sense was preferable to sound." (See: https://www.sturgislibrary.org/oldest-library/)

While that was not the direction of the article, I do wish to explore this point a little more in light of the Presidential election season we are currently in. It should be pointed out that in just a few days the outcome will be know and the candidate selected. If you read this article later in the month of November you can then be the judge, of our sense as a nation. Another way to view this is the library provides material on both sides of issues so people can educate themselves and make good choices, but are people doing so?

Now if you are looking for a prediction of the race or the outcome, you will need to look elsewhere. My purpose in exploring Mr. Franklin's comment is to illustrate the value and premise of the library, as viewed by the early founders of the United States of America. The Washington County Library mission states in part our purpose is to provide: "...spaces that promote ideas, inspire lifelong learning, and strengthen communities." The founders had confidence in the preservation of our nation, and felt it was made more assured through strong and vibrant libraries. This is illustrated in a letter from Thomas Jefferson to John Wyche as found in the Library of Congress: "I have often thought that nothing would do more extensive good at small expense than the establishment of a small circulating library in every county, to consist of a few well-chosen books, to be lent to the people of the country under regulations as would secure their safe return in due time." 
