Message From The Director

Welcome to a new year, with new beginnings in the library. I've recently had the opportunity to revise our library strategic business plan. I think it is appropriate to review the success and celebrations of the past year (or three) and highlight our strategic goal moving into 2020.

Evaluating the successes of the last three years, I would highlight our increased focus in Marketing. We have always had a part time Marketing Assistant, but we determined that it was time to dedicate more attention to Marketing the library. The end of 2018, we promoted our Marketing Assistant to a full time Marketing Specialist, and have seen great things as a result. We have had an ad on one of the busses running around town. We have had news articles in the St George News and other venues. We have increased our usage of Facebook and social media. And we have improved our advertisements within the library, like with some of our entry way TVs. As a result, we had great participation with our 100 year anniversary parties, our programming is up, and our door counts are up from previous years.

Other celebrations include a new sidewalk for easier access in Santa Clara, new parking lots in Enterprise and New Harmony, a new courier van, improved programming, improved e-audiobook collections, a mobile computer lab, makerspaces and Virtual Reality equipment in all the libraries, and so much more.

Moving into 2020, we have two main focuses. 1. We are planning to build a new addition onto the Washington library to house a new A/V Makerspace, which will include the ability to make movies, record albums, do podcasts, and more. We hope to move forward on this the beginning of 2020. The other main focus moving forward is to save money to build a new library somewhere toward the southern border. We have purchased shelving, but land, partnerships, construction, books, technology, manning, and so much more is

going to take time and money. We hope to see that develop within the next 5 to 10 years, and are in saving mode to make that a reality.


