Message From The Director

Welcome 2021! Hopefully you are better than last year! In case you missed it, let us review the "events" and their impacts to the library.

At the beginning of the year, we added parking on the south side of the library in Enterprise. This allows the snow to melt much faster during the winter, and is much safer than walking on ice. We also added parking in New Harmony for the BBQ/Park Pavilion (paid for using RAP tax funds). It's a beautiful picnic/getaway spot with an amazing view; reserve it today by calling the New Harmony branch.

Then COVID hit. Ugg. As public venues, libraries across the country were closing down. We closed down for a short while and cleaned/inventoried our collection. We reopened with curbside and then reopened in full, focusing on masking, cleaning, and social distancing.

We upgraded our inventory management (more touchless) with wands using CARES grant funding, we extended WiFi into the parking lots using CARES funds, we purchased UV book cleaners using CARES funds, and upgraded our Hotspot checkout/availability using CARES funds. We also upgraded our ability to pay fines online, and are putting credit card readers in the small branches.

RBDigital was consumed by Overdrive. I really liked RBDigital, but the good side is that we still have access to many of those eAudio book resources as we already offer Overdrive. Somewhere in there, we got hit with another flood in St. George. Our tech services staff (those who purchase, catalogue, and process new books for the library) were displaced, but still working. Our meeting rooms were closed, but we offer meeting rooms at other branches, and the construction/repairs are underway (pardon the noise).

Did I mention COVID? I hear vaccines are coming to Utah. We



are continuing to clean. We encourage the use of masks. We safely welcome you, your friends, and family to social distance with us at the library, and look forward to when that is no longer necessary. We wish you a happy and healthy New Year, and hope to see you soon!

The Mystery of Mrs. Christie by Marie Benedict gives a glimpse into the very real disappearance of beloved mystery writer, Agatha Christie. In December of 1926, the queen of mystery disappeared for eleven days. This book mixes fact and fiction in a page turner worthy of Christie herself.

UV Book Cleaners @ Your Library

During the pandemic of 2020, the branches of the Washington County Library System have seen demand skyrocket for their services. The Library System has adapted to the current environment in new and innovative ways to make sure patrons gain vital access to information and necessary services.

To protect our patrons, the Library System has recently installed Ultra Violet (UV) cleaners in each branch. You may have already seen them at your branch. Why use UV sanitizers? UV light disinfection has been around for about 100 years and is an extremely rapid physical disinfectant that is chemical-free and works at the speed of light.

According to International Library Services, these sanitizers kill 99% of Pathogenic Bacteria as well as Coronaviruses and flu viruses such as the Asian Flu, the SARS Virus, MERS, Ebola, Swine Flu, and the Covid-19 Virus.

It sanitizes books in just 30 seconds using UV-C lamps to kill the germs on both the covers and the pages of the books. It reaches the inside pages by blowing high-pressure air to spread the pages.

As we move forward, the Library System will continue to use protocols that will protect patrons from the spread of Covid-19 and other germs that can cause illness.
