## Message From The Director

November has many things going on each year, but consistently we have Thanksgiving. There are many things to be thankful for in each of our lives. The list may be different for each of us. Growing up, in elementary school and at home we always recalled the "First Thanksgiving" with the Pilgrims in 1621; however, this celebration doesn't date back to 1621 continuously. There have been gaps and breaks in this beloved American tradition. Have you ever considered who the first U.S. President was to proclaim a "Thanksgiving Day"? George Washington. In part he had this to say on October 3, 1789:

"By the President of the United States of America, a Proclamation.

Whereas it is the duty of all Nations to acknowledge the providence of Almighty God, to obey his will, to be grateful for his benefits, and humbly to implore his protection and favor-- and whereas both Houses of Congress have by their joint Committee requested me to recommend to the People of the United States a day of public thanksgiving and prayer to be observed by acknowledging with grateful hearts the many signal favors of Almighty God [....]

Now therefore I do recommend and assign Thursday the 26th day of November next to be devoted by the People of these States to the service of that great and glorious Being, who is the beneficent Author of all the good that was, that is, or that will be-- That we may then all unite in rendering unto him our sincere and humble thanks--for his kind care [....]"

November is National Picture Book Month! The picture book is often a child's first experience of looking at and reading art and words. Picture books for young Freaders are building blocks that promote literacy, vocabulary skills, and sentence structure.

Children learn to read pictures before they learn to sound out words or read full sentences, and for the very young, the partnership between pictures and text helps them take in and find pleasure in a narrative. The rhythm and rhyme of picture books makes them easy to understand and fun to read aloud, allowing children to learn words guickly. In addition, reading the same story repeatedly increases vocabulary by 12%.
