Message From The Director

Remember, July

In July we have a lot to remember, both locally and nationally. In Utah we have two significant July holidays-Independence Day on the 4th, and Pioneer Day on the 24th. The library will be closed to remember and commemorate those significant days in our history.

The library has a lot to remember, and be grateful for in our pioneer heritage. This includes the very foundation, and early establishment of library service in Washington County Utah. We can be numbered among the earliest legally established and recognized libraries in the State of Utah. From our recorded history, you may find this interesting:

"Almost before the people were settled and before they had any certain assurance of livelihood, they began to look for material for self-improvement...In 1864 the Utah Territorial Assembly passed an Act to incorporate the St. George Library Association...with all authority necessary to build and maintain or purchase for the library.... the pioneers believed in laying the right kind of foundation.... Here in the desert, far removed from the world of education, while enduring every hardship and without comforts or conveniences, almost without the necessities of life and with little assurance that they could make a success of their venture in this desolate and unattractive land, they began planning for a library through legal methods to insure their efforts a permanency that might not otherwise be achieved....Legend tells us that these pioneers raised funds for the purchase of books through produce which was collected as tickets for parties of various kinds. One quart of molasses was required as a ticket of admittance. This quart was placed in a sixty-gallon barrel until the barrel was filled, and when six of the sixty-gallon barrels were thus filled, this, with other valuable produce similarly acquired, was taken to Salt Lake City and sold or exchanged for books and other reading material. On the third floor of the new county building, at this writing a venue is running to help remember our national heritage, the spirit of sacrifice, and our national patriotism. Among the thousands of artifacts are significant items owned by Presidents Washington, Grant, Teddy Roosevelt, FDR, Lincoln, and Reagan...the presidential box of Ford's Theater, Bibles from Lincoln, King George III, King Louis XV, a Tyndale Bible, Von Stauffenburg's copy of Mein Kampf, and the bloody napkin used by Hitler after the "Operation Valkyrie" bombing. Additionally, the first draft of the Declaration of Independence...(see: https://unitedwepledge.ticketspice.com/glennbecks-blueprints-of-liberty-american-history-exhibit)

I mention these things so we remember some of the great things in our history, locally and nationally. We have the U.S. Constitution and Bill of Rights, we have patriots and pioneers, we have mush to reflect on.

Hi! My name is Jill and I work in the Children's department at the St. George Library. A few weeks ago, I read a book by Kristin L. Gray called, "The Amelia Six." I absolutely loved it! Amelia was born back in 1897 and at the age of 34 she first flew across the Atlantic. It took her 14 hours and 56 minutes. On her last flight, in 1937, (at the age of 40) Amelia's plane went down while she was attempting to cross the Pacific Ocean. She was last heard from as she left New Guinea.
