Without money to spare for anything other than food and rent, the library gave us access to books and movies that we wouldn't have been able to afford on our own. It also provided a quiet place for me to go and use the WiFi to find opportunities for employment when the shutdown was over. I can't thank the library enough for all that they do."



November is National Picture Book Month! The picture book is often a child's first experience of looking at and reading art and words. Picture books for young readers are building blocks that promote literacy, vocabulary skills, and sentence structure.

Children learn to read pictures before they learn to sound out words or read full sentences, and for the very young, the partnership between pictures and text helps them take in and find pleasure in a narrative. The rhythm and rhyme of picture books makes them easy to understand and fun to read aloud, allowing children to learn words quickly. In addition, reading the same story repeatedly increases vocabulary by 12%.
