## Author Presentation @ Washington Branch

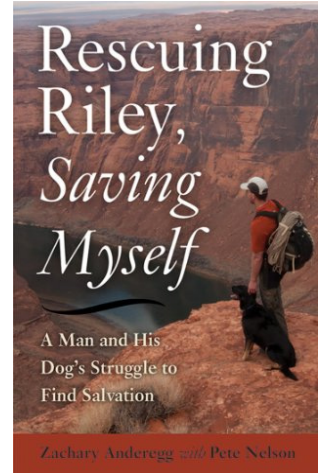
Local author Zachary Anderegg will be discussing his book entitled, "Rescuing Riley, Saving Myself" at the Washington Branch Library, 220 N. 300 E., Washington, Utah on Thursday, February 7, at 6:00 pm. The event is free to all members of the community.

The book is based on actual events. While hiking on a solo vacation in a remote region of Arizona, Zachary Anderegg

happened upon Riley, an emaciated puppy clinging to life, at the bottom of a 350-foot canyon. Zak, a former Marine, orchestrated a daring rescue that involved rappelling down the slot canyon to reach Riley. After lifting him from the canyon, Zak rushed Riley to the vet, who found that Riley had shotgun pellets beneath his skin and was severely malnourished.

But Zak and Riley's destinies were intertwined long before they improbably found each other. This book is about the rescue of Riley, and also of the personal struggles that Zak endured as he was physically and emotionally bullied throughout his childhood and teen years. Zak and Riley rescued each other, and found the means to heal.

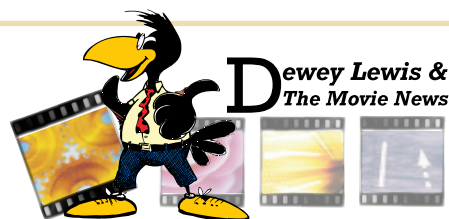

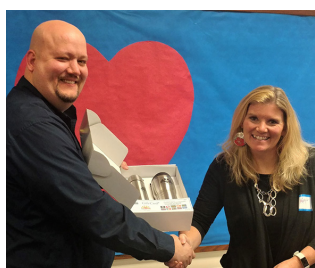

## Children's Book Review



The Dark Secret is the fourth book in the eleven book "Wings of Fire Series", written by Tui T. Sutherland. In this series, war is upon the land. There is a prophecy about five young dragons, belonging to different tribes. The prophecy tells how their eggs will be found and that they will bring peace to the land again. The first four books in the series tell the stories of each of these dragons. The fourth book, The Dark Secret, is about the dragon Starflight.

Starflight is part of the Nightwing tribe. In this book he was kidnapped, and brought to Nightwing Island. It tells how he saves some of the other tribes and his own tribe and in doing so, Starflight must face a terrible choice—his home, or his friends?

Like all the dragonets of destiny, Starflight has always wanted to see his home -- but he's also been afraid of his fellow NightWings. Starflight doesn't have mindreading powers like his tribe, and he doesn't understand why they're so secretive.

The adult dragons treat the young dragons poorly and try to control them. In spite of this, Starflight finds a way to negotiate with the other dragons. Starflight said, "I think being a good dragon is about the choices you make; no matter where you are, who raised you, or how." This is a great series for middle grade readers who enjoy fantasy fiction.
